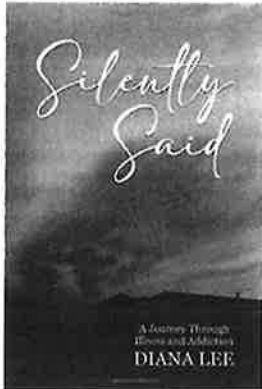

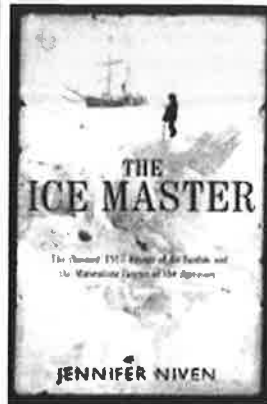
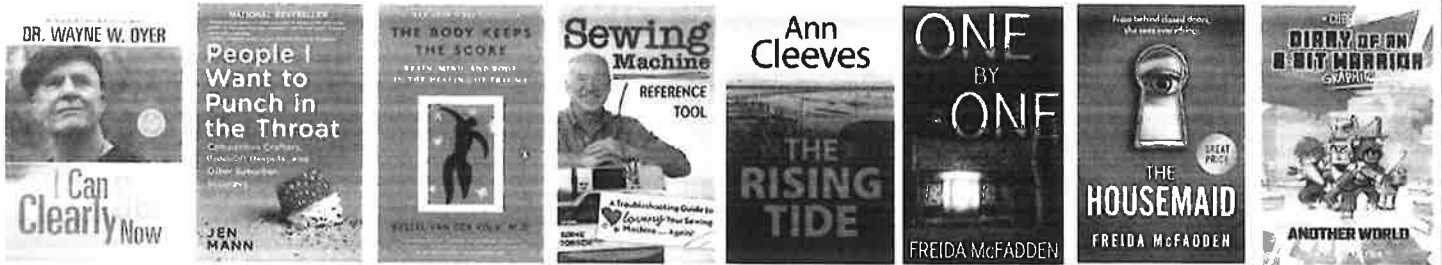

In 1913 an expedition party sailed out of British Columbia in search of an undiscovered Arctic continent. Filled with hope and excitement, the twenty-five people on board had no hint of the tragedy that lay ahead. Imprisoned in ice, abandoned by their expedition leader, and blown off course by polar storms, the Karluks crew was eventually forced to abandon ship on the ice-pack somewhere in the remote, treacherous Arctic. 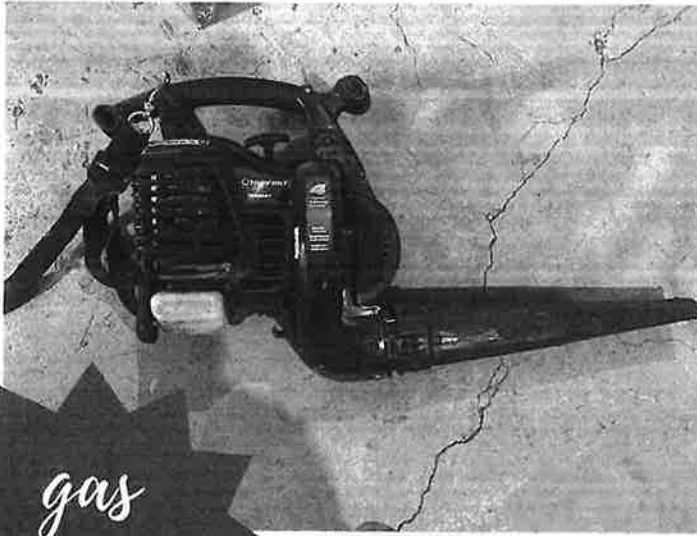

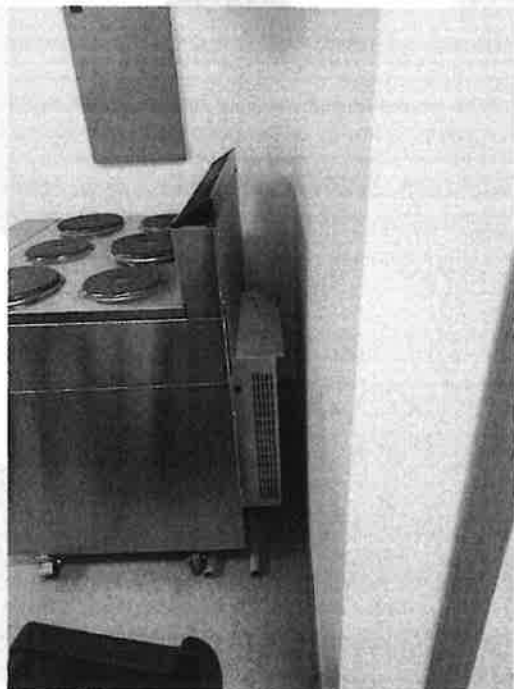

**Drinking Water Quality and Compliance
Town of Bruno
2022**

Introduction

The Water Security Agency and the Ministry of Environment requires that at least once each year waterworks owners provide notification to consumers of the quality of water produced and supplied as well as information on the performance of the waterworks in submitting samples as required by a Minister's Order or Permit to Operate a waterworks. The following is a summary of the Town of Bruno water quality and sample submission compliance record for the year of 2022. This report was completed on March 7, 2023. A minimum of 0.1 milligrams per litre (mg/L) free chlorine residual is required for water entering the distribution system. Tests are normally performed on a daily basis by the waterworks operator and are to be recorded in operation records. This data includes the number of free chlorine residual tests performed, the overall range of free chlorine residual (highest and lowest recorded values) and the number of tests and percentage of results not meeting the minimum requirement of 0.1 mg/L free chlorine residual.

Spring Safety Tips

The following safety tips can be used to educate your community as the weather warms.

Properly use and store gasoline:

- Use gasoline only as motor fuel, and never as a cleaner or to break down grease.
- Only store gasoline in a container that is sold for that purpose and never bring it indoors, even in small amounts.
- Never store gasoline containers in a basement or in the occupied space of a building. Keep them in a detached garage or an outdoor shed.
- Make sure the container is tightly capped when not in use.

Use and store flammable and combustible liquids with care:

- Flammable and combustible liquids should not be used near an open flame.
- Never smoke when working with these liquids.
- Keep liquids in their original containers. Keep them tightly capped or sealed. Never store the liquids in glass containers.

Keep debris well away from your home:

- Dispose of branches, weeds, leaves, pine needles and grass clippings that you have cut to reduce fuel for fire.
- Remove leaves, pine needles and other flammable material from the roof, gutters and on and under the deck to help prevent embers from igniting your home.
- Remove dead vegetation and other flammable materials, especially within the first five feet of your home.
- Move construction material, trash, and woodpiles at least 30 feet away from the home and other outbuildings.

Practice fire safety when cooking:

- Be on alert! If you are tired or have consumed alcohol don't use the stove or stovetop.
- Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, boiling, grilling or broiling food. If you leave the kitchen for even a short time, turn off the stove.
- Keep anything that can catch fire – oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels – away from the stovetop.
- The leading cause of fires in the kitchen is unattended cooking.

Clean out your clothes dryer:

- Make sure the air exhaust vent pipe for your dryer is not restricted and that the outdoor vent flap will open when the dryer is operating. This includes making sure the outdoor vent is not covered by snow or ice.
- Move things that can burn, such as boxes, cleaning supplies and clothing, away from the dryer.
- Clothes that have come in contact with flammable substances like gasoline, paint thinner, or similar solvents should be laid outside to dry, then can be washed and dried as usual.

Report a controlled burn anywhere in the province:

Call **1-866-404-4911** - the number is answered 24/7 – 365 days.

Questions you will be asked:

- What is your land location?
- What is your RM number?
- Who is your Fire Service Provider?
- What are the location details?
- What are you burning?
- How long will your burn last?
- Your name and phone number.

You will be asked to call back once the burn has been completed.

If you plan to burn in or within 4.5 kilometres of the provincial forest during the wildfire season (April 1 to October 31), you may also need a burn notification number. These are available from your local SPSA Protection Area Office.

Prevent Grass Fires:

Help protect your home by:

- Disposing of cigarettes and matches correctly. Do not throw them out of a vehicle.
- Making fire breaks that can slow a fire's progress. They are areas that have been ploughed, mowed or even grazed.
- Keeping your lawn cut and your gardens and paths well-maintained.
- Teaching your children not to play with fire or with matches.
- Not using machines or tools that may cause sparks during dry conditions. If you must use a tool such as a grinder, wet down your working area and have a fire extinguisher handy. ■



Download the SaskAlert App Today

SaskAlert is Saskatchewan's emergency public alerting program, which is used to alert the public in real-time of an emergency. It provides information that enables the public to take action to protect themselves. SaskAlert is part of a national public alerting initiative that is supported by the federal, provincial, and territorial governments – where emergency alerts are distributed across Canada from one alerting system.

Alerts can be issued for any event that has the potential of harming people or damaging property. Events can include tornadoes, plow winds and blizzards.

Other events include wildfires, spills of hazardous material, train derailments, boil water advisories, evacuations, or local emergency declarations.
