June 14 – June 25 “The Thing Lou Couldn’t Do” By: Ashley Spires



"Lou and her friends are BRAVE adventurers. They run FASTER than airplanes. They build MIGHTY fortresses. They rescue WILD animals." But one day, when they're looking for a ship to play pirates in, Lou's friend has an idea: "Up there! The tree can be our ship!" perfectly depicts what children go through when confronted with something difficult. With humor and endearing artwork, Spires sensitively portrays Lou procrastinating, making excuses, imagining alternatives and denying she cares. Ultimately, Lou faces her fear, and although she fails, the effort empowers her, encouraging a growth mindset. All the while, Lou's friends model compassionate friendship by offering to teach her how to climb and then moving the game. This book makes a perfect choice for a character education discussion about courage or resilience, or a life-skills lesson on facing challenges. The story also promotes the joy of imaginative play in the outdoors.

June 28 – July 9 “The Crocodile who Didn’t Like Water” By: Gemma Merino

Meet a most unusual crocodile! Everybody knows that crocodiles love water, but this little crocodile is different. He doesn't like water at all. In fact, he prefers climbing trees! But it can be lonely when you're the odd one out, so the little crocodile tries his best to change. But being wet isn't for everyone - and a shiver soon becomes a cold and the cold becomes a sneeze, a very hot sneeze... Could it be that this little crocodile isn't a crocodile at all? He might just be a DRAGON!

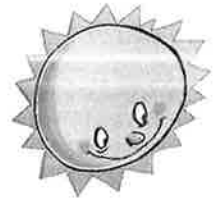


July 18 - July 30 “Duck On a Bike” By: David Shannon

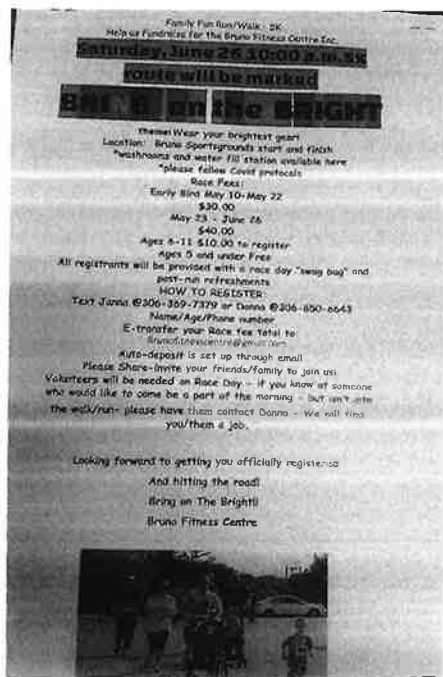

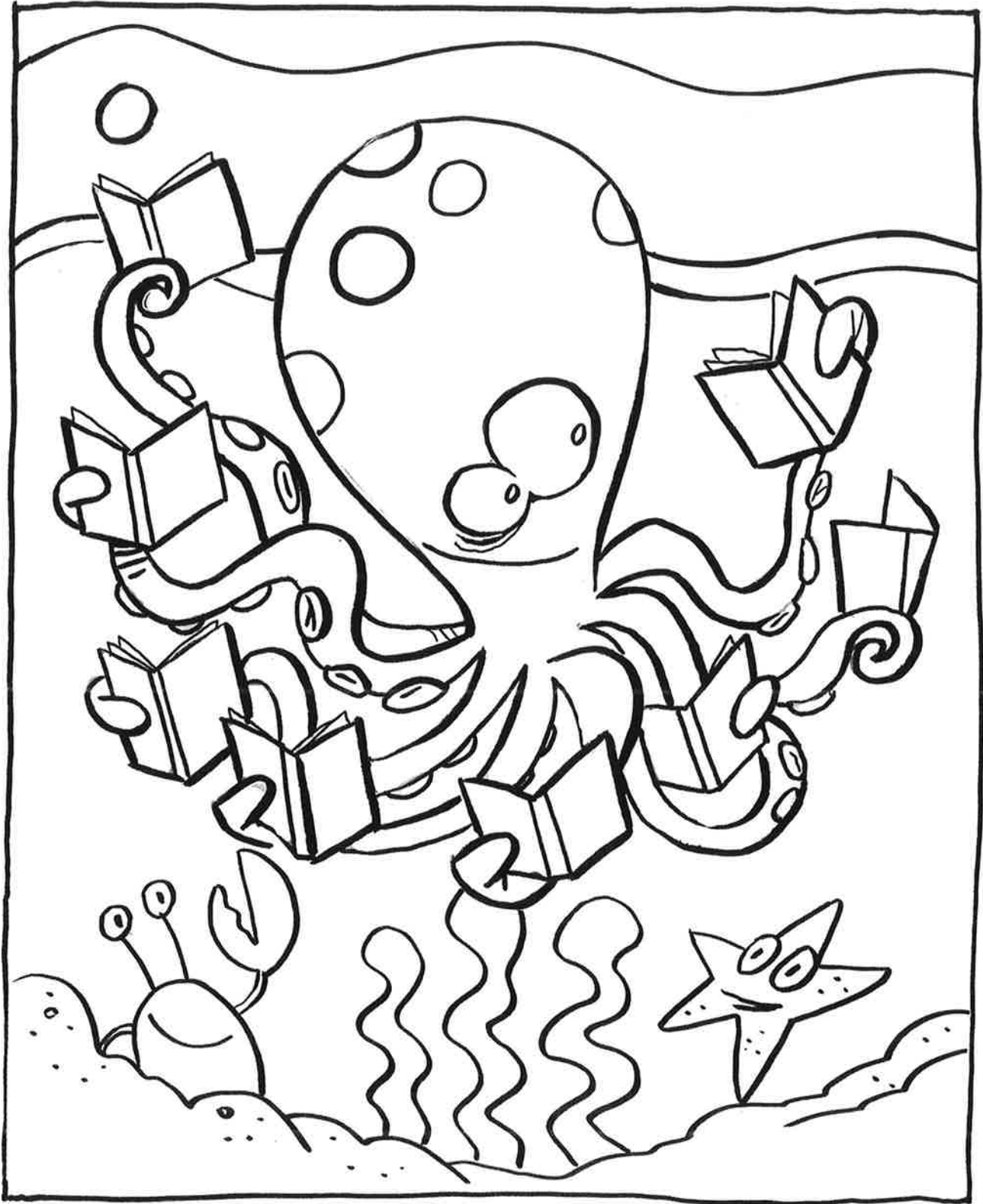

Your lawn and garden clippings must be kept on your own lot. When piling your compost and leaves for pick up, please leave your grass, leaves and compost separated.

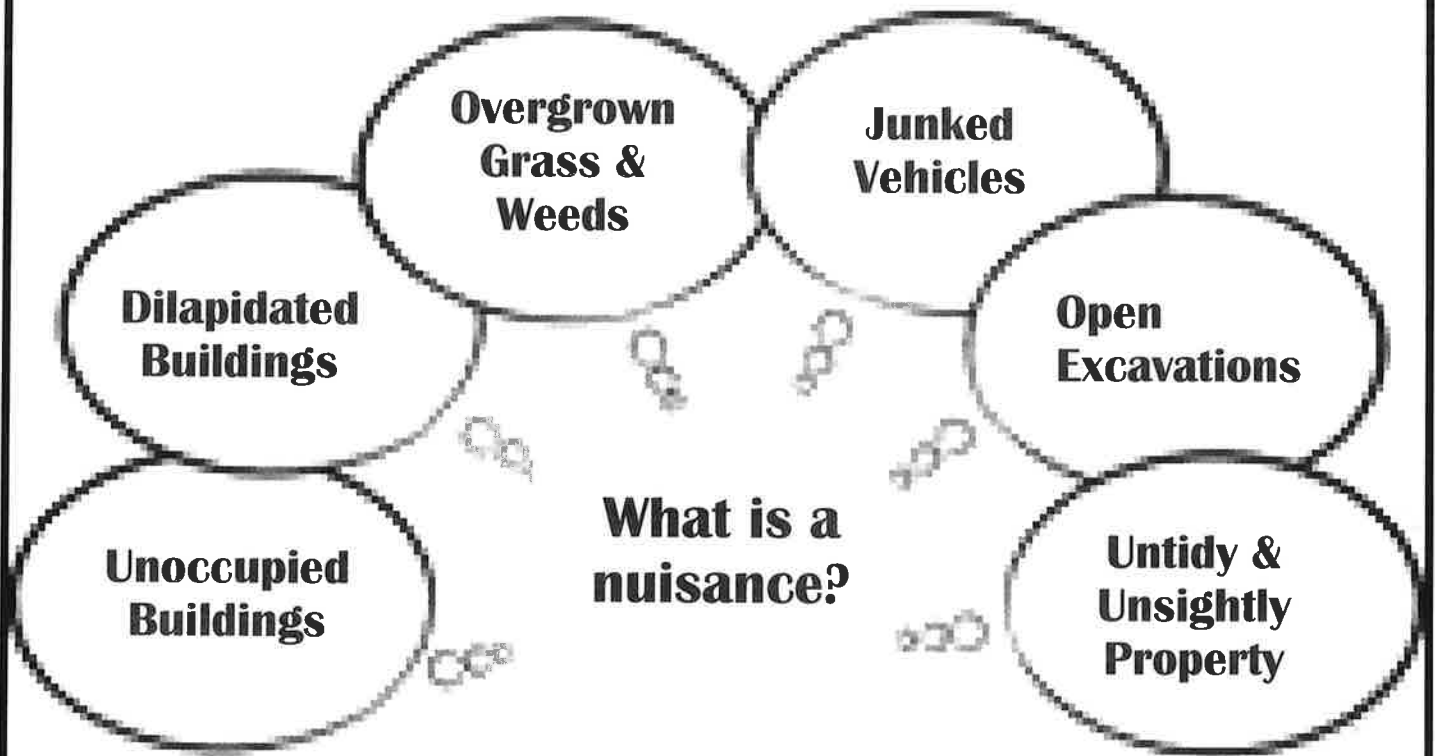
MIXED PILES WILL NOT BE PICKED UP BY THE TOWN.

Nuisance Abatement Bylaw



Unoccupied Buildings

No person shall cause or permit an unoccupied building to become damaged or deteriorate into a state of despair such that the building is an imminent danger to public safety

Overgrown Grass & Weeds

The occupant shall not permit the land to be overgrown by grass and weeds "overgrown" refers to 0.20 meters in height

Dilapidated Buildings

No person shall allow a building to:
Become dangerous to the public health or safety
Depreciates the value of the land or neighbourhood

Junked Vehicles

No person shall cause or permit any junked vehicle to be kept on any land owned by that person.
"Junked Vehicle" is an automobile that has no valid license plate, is rusted, wrecked or dismantled.

Open Excavations

No person shall permit any basement, excavation, drain, ditch, pond, swimming pool or other structure to exist where it is dangerous to public safety or health

Untidy & Unsightly Property

No person shall cause or permit any land or buildings to become untidy & unsightly.
