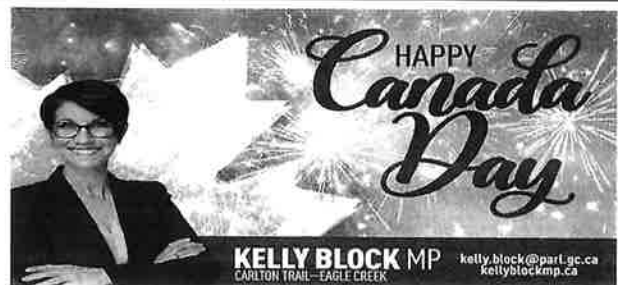
June 28 – July 9 “The Crocodile who Didn’t Like Water”

So, to clear up any rumours, misunderstanding or assumptions.....

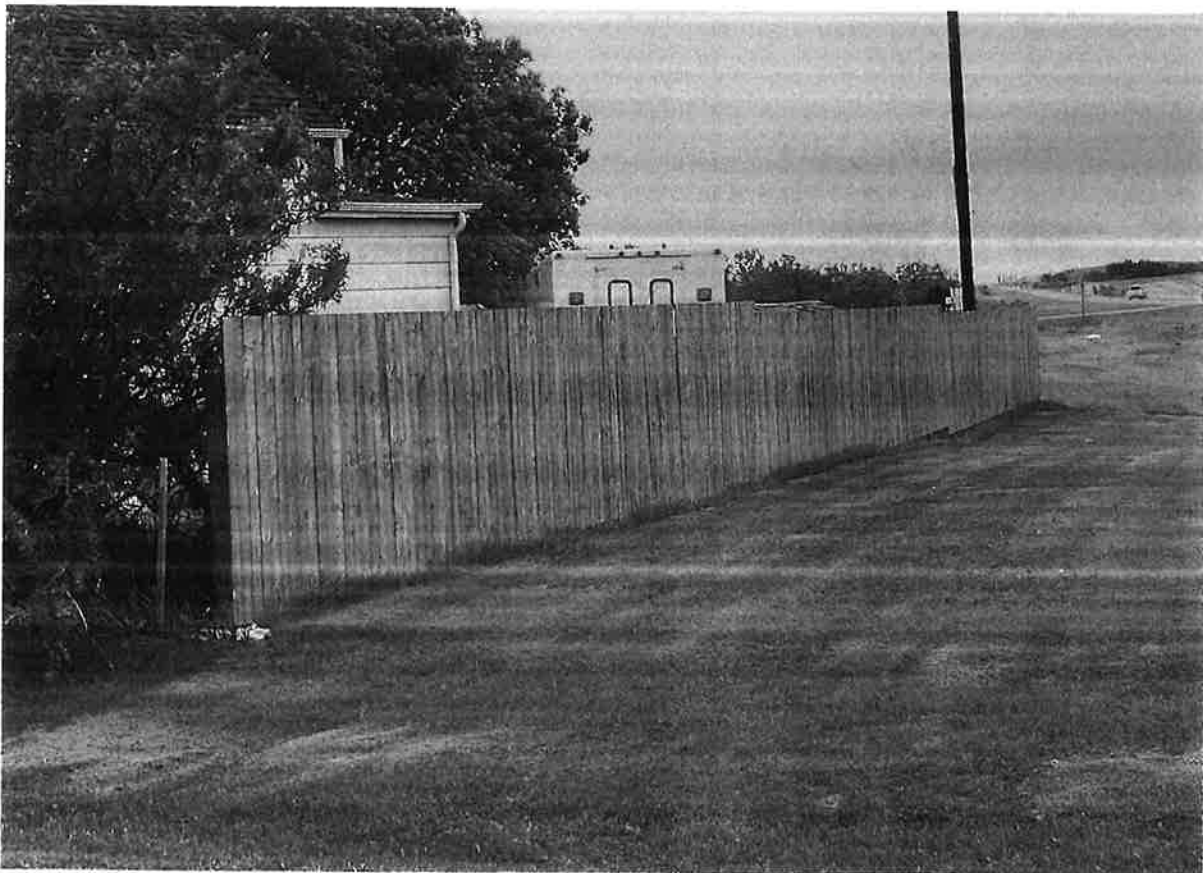
The Town does not build fences for private residents, the fence is in fact the Town's, on Town property.

LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT NEWS

The Humboldt/Lanigan RCMP Detachment has launched the Online Crime Reporting service in the province. Beginning on March 8, Online Crime Reporting allows area residents with a valid email address and internet connection to report selected crimes online using a computer or cellphone.

An RCMP news release states, "When crime is reported to police, it provides a clearer picture of the types and number of crimes occurring in a specific area. This information can launch future police projects and initiatives. In addition, crime statistics are one of several components analyzed when determining officer deployment in RCMP detachments and units."

The following crimes can be reported through the Online Crime Reporting tool:

- Damage/mischief to property under \$5,000
- Theft of bicycle under \$5,000
- Theft under \$5,000
- Theft from vehicle under \$5,00
- Lost or found property
- Damage/mischief to vehicle under \$5000

Incidents must also satisfy the following conditions to be reported online:

- No witnesses or suspects
- Item(s) lost or stolen must cost less than \$5,000
- Vandalized property that will cost less than \$5,000 to repair
- There are no items involving personal identity, firearms, license plates or decals

ANOTHER BRICK IN THE WALL FUNDRAISER

The Old Firehall in the Town of Bruno borders the south side Of Heritage Park. Over the years, trees have damaged the back wall and this fundraiser aims to help recoup some of the costs associated with the repair.

Because of the buildings Heritage status, proper mortar and replacement bricks will come with a significant cost.

Recognize the Signs of Heat Illness

Heat Cramps

- muscular pains/spasms
- cramps most often attack the abdomen and legs

Heat Exhaustion

- cool, moist, pale skin
- heavy sweating
- headache
- nausea or vomiting
- dizziness

Heat Stroke

- most severe, can be fatal
- hot, red, dry skin
- rapid, weak pulse
- rapid, shallow breathing

Prevent Dehydration



- If you plan to exercise during high heat, begin drinking water one to two hours before you start.
- After extended periods of exercise or exertion, sports drinks containing carbohydrates and electrolytes help prevent dehydration.
- If you drink too much water, there is a hazard of "water intoxication" and hyponatremia (low blood sodium).
