Q: My card is expired. What do I do?

A: Please email branchmanager@wheatland.sk.ca and we will renew your card for you as soon as possible.

Q: Should I return library materials I currently have out?

A: Please hold onto your library materials for now. Fines will not be charged/accumulated between March 16th and April 14th.

Q: What will happen to my holds? Will they still be there?

A: Yes, once the library branch reopens all holds will be available to pick up at the location they're currently held at.

Q: Can I still request and place holds?

A: No. Holds have been temporarily frozen province-wide. We will provide an update when this changes. Interlibrary Loans have also been temporarily suspended.

Q: What to do if my card is blocked because of fines and I can't use digital materials?

A: We have successfully remedied this issue and anyone with a library card should be able to access all digital resources regardless of fines and fees on their accounts. Please email branchmanager@wheatland.sk.ca if you are still experiencing issues.

Q: Where can I find information about COVID-19?

A: We are following information from the Government of Saskatchewan and the Public Health Agency of Canada. If you start having symptoms of COVID-19, isolate yourself from others as quickly as possible. Immediately call a health care professional or the Saskatchewan public Health Authority by dialing 811. They will provide advice on what you should do.

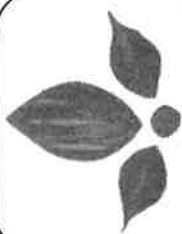

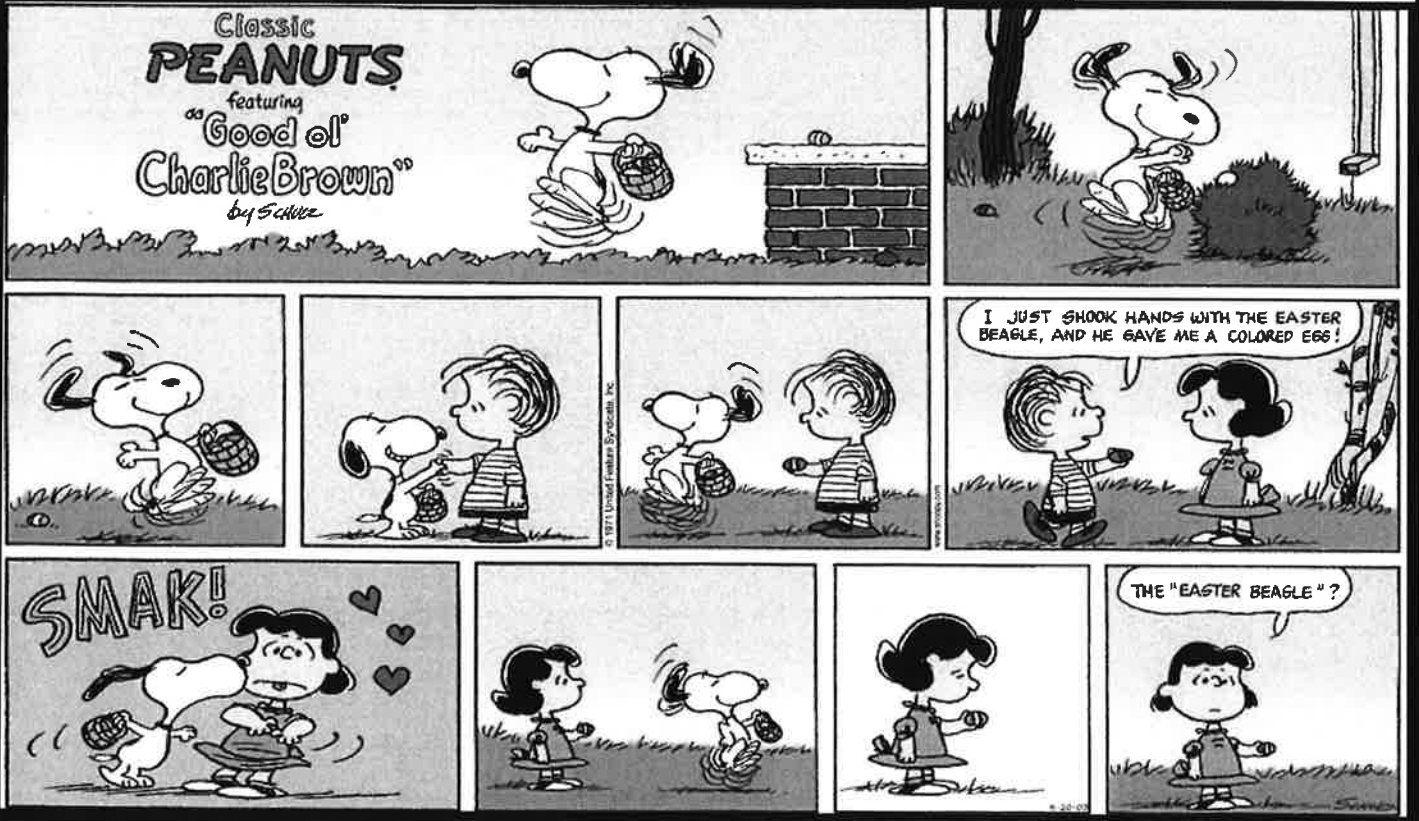
Have 30-day supply of prescriptions, including things like backup inhalers, and basic medications such as aspirin or ibuprofen.

UPDATE 2019

PUBLIC WORKS

2019 saw a few employee changes with the retirement of Mr. Proctor and the addition of Landon Yaworski and Chris Kramer.

With new staff comes more training – confined space training, WHMIS, chainsaw safety course, 3A licensing, and water and wastewater courses to name a few.

New LED lights were installed in the shop to conserve energy.

Our sweeper died and a deal has been made for another to arrive in the Spring of 2020. Without the sweeper no road work could be done in 2019.

The Water Treatment plant has had a new variable frequency device as well as a new pump head installed. This allows for better energy consumption and ensures consistent supply.

A valve exerciser wrench was purchased to allow the workers to “exercise” shut off valves around town to ensure they are all kept in working order.

Directional drilling was used to repair a service connection to a resident on Main street, this is the first time this type of drilling has been utilized in the Town.

A minor water break on Main street has left a gravel patch in front of the café. This patch will need to settle before repairs can be made to the street – please be patient.

Drainage ditches were cleaned up and some cement curbs poured

Hydrant replacements were done at Railway N & 3rd Street, 700 block Grid Road and in front of the school

OFFICE

Megan Deli returned from Maternity leave in the last half of 2019 and we said goodbye to Bonnie Hauber our temporary replacement.

Megan took over the Town of Bruno Facebook and Instagram accounts and has been busy with interesting posts.

Colette Radcliffe obtained her standard certification in Local Government Authority.

Office renovations included LED lighting, a renovation to the Council Chamber, purchase of a new photocopier, and new reception computer.

RECREATION FACILITIES

Artificial Ice was installed in 2019 – The Artificial Ice committee did an amazing job in getting the project up and going so fast!

The hall in the top of the Rink had some flooring work done to extend its life and prevent damage to the wood floor.

The old Curling Rink was converted to an Archery Range with help from the Bruno Wildlife Federation. Plans are for the Wildlife Federation to lease the space as their new clubhouse!

Bruno Library had a roof upgrade! The old tar roofing was removed and new tin roofing added.

The Golf Course tractor was repaired and the Golf Club had a new synthetic green installed on hole 9, future plans on upgrading additional holes.

New clean-up after dog signs were installed around town.

Cement pad and table were installed in Pioneer Park

**Drinking Water Quality and Compliance

Introduction

The Water Security Agency (WSA) requires that at least once each year waterworks owners provide notification to consumers of the quality of water produced and supplied as well as information on the performance of the waterworks in submitting samples as required by a Permit to Operate a Waterworks. The following is a summary of the Town of Bruno's water quality and sample submission compliance record for the January 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019 time period. This report was completed on February 25th, 2020. Readers should refer to the Agency's Municipal Drinking Water Quality Monitoring Guidelines, November 2015, EPB 202 for more information on minimum sample submission requirements and the meaning of type of sample. Permit requirements for a specific waterworks may require more sampling than outlined in the Agency's monitoring guidelines. 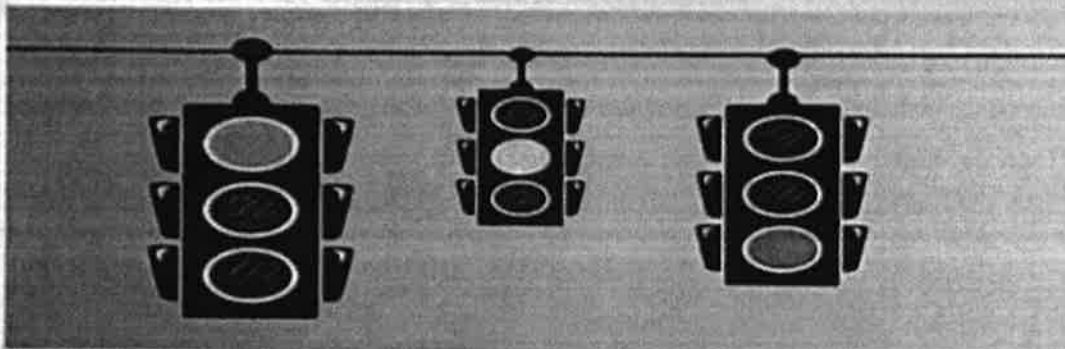

ABOUT CORONAVIRUS DISEASE (COVID-19)

WHAT IT IS

COVID-19 is an illness caused by a coronavirus.

Human coronaviruses are common and are typically associated with mild illnesses, similar to the common cold.

HOW IT IS SPREAD

Coronaviruses are most commonly **SPREAD** from an infected person through:

- ▶ respiratory droplets when you cough or sneeze
- ▶ close personal contact, such as touching or shaking hands
- ▶ touching something with the virus on it, then touching your eyes, nose or mouth before washing your hands

These viruses are not known to spread through ventilation systems or through water.

IF YOU HAVE SYMPTOMS

If you have **SYMPTOMS** of COVID-19 — fever, cough, or difficulty breathing:

- ▶ stay home to avoid spreading it to others
 - if you live with others, stay in a separate room or keep a 2-metre distance
- ▶ call ahead before you visit a health care professional or call your local public health authority
 - tell them your symptoms and follow their instructions
- ▶ if you need immediate medical attention, call 911 and tell them your symptoms.

SYMPTOMS

Symptoms may be very mild or more serious. They may take up to 14 days to appear after exposure to the virus.

PREVENTION

The best way to prevent the spread of infections is to:

- ▶ wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds
- ▶ avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth, especially with unwashed hands
- ▶ avoid close contact with people who are sick
- ▶ when coughing or sneezing:
 - cover your mouth and nose with your arm or tissues to reduce the spread of germs
 - immediately dispose of any tissues you have used into the garbage as soon as possible and wash your hands afterwards
- ▶ clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces, such as toys, electronic devices and doorknobs.
- ▶ stay home if you are sick to avoid spreading illness to others
