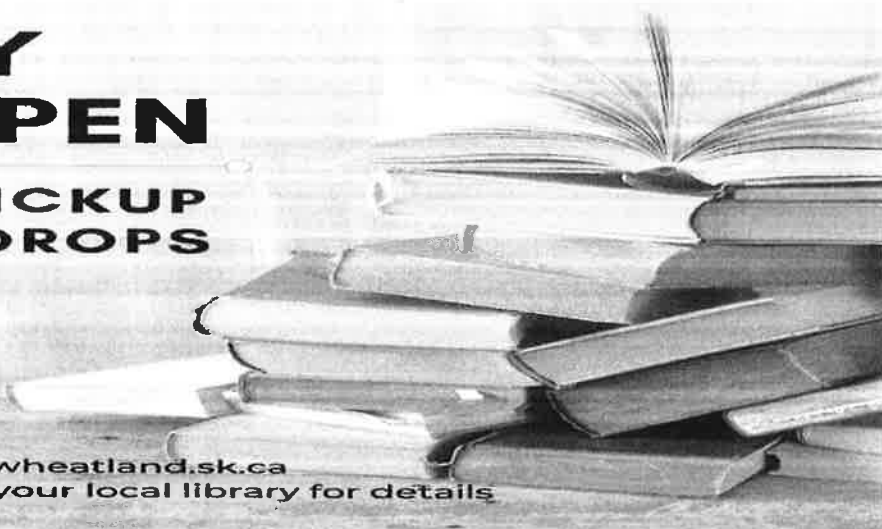

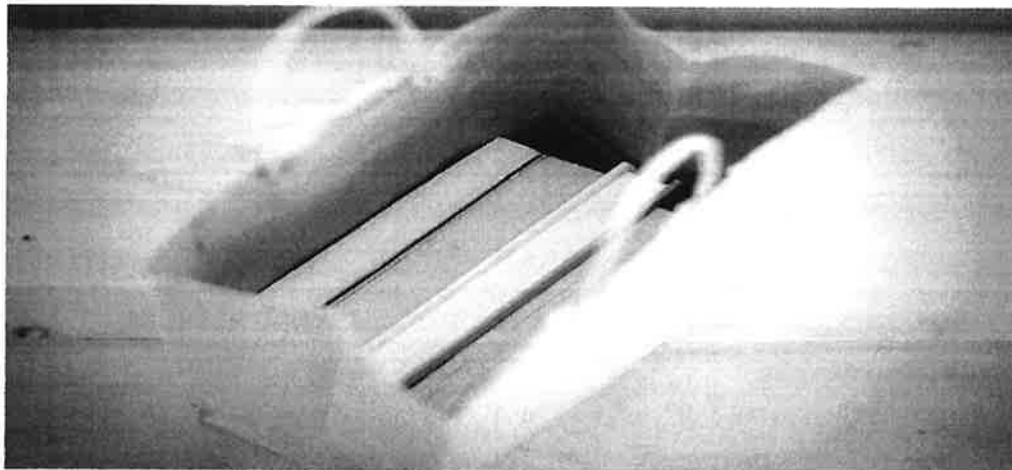

### **Notice to Homeowners**

Please be sure to trim your trees and bushes around municipal sidewalks, roads and alleyways. Many sidewalks are becoming overtaken by trees and shrubs and are scratching vehicles as they drive through.

It is your responsibility to make sure your trees remain on your property so please check yours and trim as needed.

### **NO DUMPING GRASS CLIPPINGS OR COMPOST ON MUNICIPAL OR VACANT LOTS OR DITCHES**

Your lawn and garden clippings must be kept on your own lot! When piling your compost and leaves for pick up, please keep your grass, leaves and compost separated. **Mixed piles will not be picked up by the Town!**

COMPOST, LEAVES and BRANCHES are FREE to haul to the transfer station on your own.

Please be sure to keep your house numbers visible! It is not just for convenience of finding your address, but is vital for emergency responders to be able to locate those when in need. When responding to an emergency, minutes matter, so be sure that fire, ambulance and police personnel can easily and quickly find your address.

Script numbers may be aesthetically pleasing but can be difficult to read quickly, it's best to stick with regular numbers. If your house is farther than 45ft from the curb you should have your number on a fence, mailbox, or other appropriate, more visible place and make sure no trees or shrubs are blocking it.

Be sure to select house numbers that contrast well with the house, for example it's easier to see white numbers on a blue house than it is to see black or grey.

**2020 ANNUAL WATERWORKS INFORMATION POLICY**

**POLICY 05/2020 Resolution: 218/2020**

**DATE:** July 21<sup>st</sup>, 2020

**WATERWORKS RATE POLICY**

Bylaw #16/2019 was passed August 20<sup>th</sup>, 2019 for the 2020 year.

The waterworks rate policy for 2020 is:

- the minimum rate charge of \$151.04 per quarter for a maximum of 5,000 gallons of water
- the per 1000-gallon water rate of \$26.19 for usage above the 5,000-gallon minimum;
- A flat rate fee for sewer service at \$151.04 per quarter,
- a total minimum of \$302.08 per quarter.
- These rates were to ensure that water & sewer works revenues cover water and sewer works operating costs.

**THE WATERWORKS RATE POLICY FOR 2021**

The Town of Bruno at its August 2020 meeting will pass a Bylaw to update the rates to be charged for the use and consumption of water and sewer for 2021.

The waterworks rate policy for 2021 will be:

- the minimum rate charge of \$166.14 per quarter for a maximum of 5,000 gallons of water
- the per 1000-gallon water rate of \$28.81 for usage above the 5,000-gallon minimum;
- A flat rate fee for sewer service at \$166.14 per quarter,
- a total minimum of \$332.28 per quarter.
- These rates will to ensure that water & sewer works revenues cover water and sewer works operating costs.

For waterworks, operating costs and expenditures include staff salaries, benefits, training, water from SaskWater, utilities, insurance, chemicals, equipment, and building maintenance. The major cost is of purchasing treated river water from SaskWater.

This waterworks rate policy should allow the Town to reserve some funding annually to help offset future waterworks infrastructure needs.

Below provides the planned flat rate for 5,000 gallon rate and the per 1000 gallon water rate projected increases over five years from 2018.

The objective of the waterworks rate policy is to work towards waterworks that are self-financing, where the users pay for the cost of the service. To accomplish this, waterworks rates need to increase over time in relation to expenses, so that the revenues cover operating costs. Council will review its waterworks policy annually to determine if revenues are covering costs.

**WATERWORKS CAPITAL INVESTMENT STRATEGY**

The objective of the waterworks capital investment strategy is to address anticipated waterworks infrastructure maintenance, immediate drinking water infrastructure problems and future infrastructure replacements in a timely fashion so as to ensure the

municipal waterworks provides safe drinking water collection for residents and businesses. The strategy uses the 2011 and 2015 Waterworks System Assessment as required by Saskatchewan Environment for infrastructure planning. In 2018 The Town of Bruno completed a Sanitary & Storm Network Asset Management Plan as well as a Water Network Management Plan. These Asset Management plans will be utilized by the Town of Bruno in future Capital Asset planning and Acquisitions. The Town of Bruno intends to continue building our reserve fund through budgeted revenue surpluses annually.
